

# HOUSE BAYS



## AGE CHAMPIONS

Students who accumulate the most points in their year division will be declared Age Group champion.

## RIBBONS

Ribbons will be distributed to students who place 1st, 2nd or 3rd in any race by the place judge.

## DISQUALIFICATION

Students may be disqualified in the following instances:

- Pulling or pushing along the wall or lane ropes
- Leaving the blocks or wall prior to the start signal
- Failure to contact the wall correctly (one hand for freestyle/backstroke & two hands for breaststroke/butterfly)

Professional judgement needs to be applied regarding encouragement versus disqualification in all races.

## ROLE DESCRIPTIONS

### Referee:

It is the referee's job to see that the competition rules are followed. The referee may need to disqualify or explain the rules to people concerned. It is also their role to ensure the event runs to program.

### Starter:

You oversee starting all swim events with the beep. Don't forget that the timekeepers will let you know when they are ready (Recorder should hold up hand to confirm). Remind students to touch the wall with one hand (freestyle/backstroke) and two hands (breaststroke/butterfly).

### Marshal:

It is your job to collect the students in the Marshalling area and organise swimmers for races and the correct swimmer in the correct lane. There should be a line of swimmers on the blocks, a line of swimmers on the chair behind & one line of swimmers standing behind the line in chairs and so on. Advice is to marshal deep and progress the swimmers forward in the chairs as the events are swum.

### Place Judge:

Your job is to issue 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> from each race. In the event of a close finish consult with the timekeepers and recorder.

### Timekeepers:

Your job is to time the race. Push the button to stop only.

### Recorder:

Your job is to record all the times next to the correct names in each race from timekeepers. The sheet then needs to be passed to data entry.



### **Data Entry:**

Timing solutions will be used on the day. Once the ribbons distributor has finished with the results sheet, you are to collate the information on the computer. At intervals you need to pass progressive house results to the referee to provide house points updates.

### **Ribbons Distribution:**

Your job is to fill out the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> ribbons as you receive the result sheet from the recorder. It is very important that you instruct the 1<sup>st</sup> place student to take the sheet directly to data entry so points can be entered afterwards. All 4 swimmers get ribbons in relays.

### **First Aid Officer:**

Staff must be readily available to attend to injuries throughout the whole event. Escort any student in need of care to the first aid section located in the pool office for assessment and treatment. If the person cannot be moved send for help.

### **House Bay Supervisors:**

Your job is to monitor the conduct of students in their house groups and ensure that no student moves out of the premises at any time without your permission. You will also need to check toilets at regular intervals as well as assist the house marshal in organising the students to be ready to move with the house marshal.

### **Novelty:**

Priority is given to students who have not competed in other events. These 'races' will be run over 25m and also in the LTS pool. One swimmer at a time in the water in each lane. A variety of challenges may be set and could include inflatable devices. Staff from Royal Lifesaving WA may be involved with the coordination of the novelty events.

### **House Escorts:**

Your job is to organise and escort students to the marshal area when the announcer calls for that race. It is a good idea to marshal students in prior to the call of the race to avoid delay.





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
