### CREATING ACCESSIBLE MICROSOFT WORD 2016 DOCUMENTS (WINDOWS)

#### Heading Styles

*Create a uniform heading structure through use of styles in Word.* This allows screen readers to navigate a document and improves accessiblity for everyone.

- 1. Start a new line to create a heading, or select text to change to a heading.
- 2. Open the *Home* tab, and choose the appropriate heading in the *Styles* panel.
- 3. Headings 1, 2, or 3 can also be assigned using *Ctrl* + *Alt* + *1*, *2*, or *3*, respectively.

#### v View 🛛 Tell me what you want to do....

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#### Alternative Text

*Images can be given appropriate alternative text in Word.* Alt text is read by a screen reader in a Word file and should remain intact when exporting to HTML or PDF.

1. Right-click on the image and select *Format Picture*.

#### Lists

Use *true numbered and bulleted lists* to emphasize a point or a sequence of steps.

- 1. Select the *Home* tab on the ribbon.
- Choose the Numbered List or Bulleted List option from the Paragraph group.

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#### Hyperlinks

Insert Heperlerk

Word *automatically creates a hyperlink* when a user pastes a full URL onto a page. These may not make sense to screen reader users, so make sure the link text is unique.

- Select a hyperlink, right click, and select *Hyperlink* or hit *Ctrl + k*.
- Change the text in the *Text to Display* field to a more meaningful description.

### Data Tables

Accessible tables need a *clear table structure* and *table headers* to help guide a screen reader user.

 Select the *Insert* tab on the ribbon, then select *Table > Insert Table*.



2. To add table headers to the first row, select

Table Tools > Layout on the ribbon, then choose the Repeat Header Rows option in the Data section.

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Options in the **Design** tab may be used to change appearance but will not provide the necessary accessibility information.

# Applying Section 508 to PowerPoint

### W3C's WCAG Priorities (World Wide Web Consortium) (Web Content Accessibility Group)



Each checkpoint has a priority level assigned by the Working Group based on the checkpoint's impact on accessibility.

### A [Priority 1]

A Web content developer must satisfy this checkpoint. Otherwise, one or more groups will find it **impossible** to access information in the document. Satisfying this checkpoint is a basic requirement for some groups to be able to use Web documents.

### AA [Priority 2]

A Web content developer should satisfy this checkpoint. Otherwise, one or more groups will find it **difficult** to access information in the document. Satisfying this checkpoint will remove significant barriers to accessing Web documents.

### AAA [Priority 3]

A Web content developer may address this checkpoint. Otherwise, one or more groups will find it **somewhat difficult** to access information in the document. Satisfying this checkpoint will improve access to Web documents.

Some checkpoints specify a priority level that may change under certain (indicated) conditions.





## The Four Principles of Accessibility

(From WCAG for web pages but can be extended to other electronic content like PDF Documents

Web Content must be:

**Perceivable** - Information and user interface components must be presentable to users in ways they can perceive.

This means that users must be able to perceive the information being presented (it can't be invisible to all of their senses)

**Operable** - User interface components and navigation must be operable.

This means that users must be able to operate the interface **(the interface cannot require interaction that a user cannot perform)** 

**Understandable** - Information and the operation of user interface must be understandable.

This means that users must be able to understand the information as well as the operation of the user interface **(the content or operation cannot be beyond their understanding)** 

**Robust** - Content must be robust enough that it can be interpreted reliably by a wide variety of user agents, including assistive technologies.

This means that users must be able to access the content as technologies advance **(as technologies and user agents evolve, the content should remain accessible)**

### INTRODUCTION

For the majority of us maneuvering through websites, reading attachments to emails, completing applications, and requesting online information seems to be a relatively easy task.

- But for the 3 out of every 100 individuals that either due to low vision or blindness, uses a screen reader, tasks like these can be daunting.
- An estimated 48.9 million people, or 19.4% of the noninstitutionalized civilians, have a disability. An estimated 24.1 million people have a severe disability. An estimated 34.2 million people, or 17.5%, have a functional limitation.

## **Other Considerations**

- Ensure font size is sufficient. If your presentation will be viewed on a projector, font size may need to be even larger.
- Provide sufficient contrast. If your presentation will be viewed on a projector, sometimes the contrast needs to be even more pronounced.
- Do not use color as the only way to convey meaning.
- Avoid automatic slide transitions.
- Use simple slide transitions when possible.
- Do not put accessibility information like alternative text in the Notes pane.
- If you have embedded video, ensure it is captioned.
- If you have embedded audio, include a transcript.
- If your slides contain animations, ensure they are brief and do not distract from the most important content on the page.
- Use simple language.

#### **Please Note!**

Due to the nature of Google Docs, some accessibility features such as tables are only fully accessible when exporting the document as a PDF. This is due to the fact that a Google Doc uses a simple grid mechanism for layout purposes and has no notion of a 'data' table.
