#### **Background**

With 2030 on the horizon, achieving gender equality (SDG 5) faces significant challenges, with no country currently on track. Data gaps, particularly on SDG 5.a (women's land rights), impede the development of evidence-based policies to address unequal land tenure security, combat discriminatory laws and social norms and advance gender-responsive policies in agrifood systems.

Women's land rights are crucial for women's well-being, economic empowerment, and participation, and for broader development outcomes, like poverty reduction and food security. They are key to accelerating progress on SDG 5 and interconnected development goals. Enhanced tenure security and women's empowerment correlate with better health, nutrition and access to services (SDG 3) and enable greater economic engagement in agrifood systems (SDG 8). Multi-stakeholder platforms and innovative partnerships (SDG 17), like FAO's Commit to Grow Equality (CGE) initiative and the Global Land Observatory, are pivotal to fostering responsible land governance, accelerate data analysis and use and drive action.

This side event will explore evidence-based approaches and innovative partnerships to advance women's land rights and decent employment for transformative change in agrifood systems.

### **Objectives**

- Highlight the importance of women's land rights and decent employment in empowering women and advancing SDG 5 and other SDGs, including SDG 8 and 17, emphasizing SDG 5.a indicators;
- Showcase evidence-based and innovative solutions that address structural inequalities, advance women's land rights and improve access to decent jobs;
- Showcase initiatives that accelerate financing and partnerships for women's empowerment and gender equality in agrifood systems;
- Provide a platform for dialogue and partnership among stakeholders to exchange experiences and identify opportunities for collaboration.
