





EDUCATION MULTIPLIES POSSIBILITIES: INVESTING IN OUR FUTURE

Context

As the world faces major shifts in demographics, AI, and the future of work, quality education for all is essential for economic growth and stability. Over the past 40 years, education has driven half of global economic growth and two-thirds in the poorest countries, while cutting extreme poverty by 40%. It prepares learners with skills for 21st-century jobs and helps buffer against political and economic insecurity.

Yet, more than 270 million children and youth are out of school, and that number is rising. 70% of 10-year-olds in low-income countries can't read a simple text. Reaching global education goals (SDG4) faces a \$97 billion annual funding gap, as domestic budgets strain and international aid declines.

To address this, we need a fundamental shift in education financing, moving away from fragmented gap-filling towards coherent, sustainable financing models that enable system transformation. These approaches can bring the developed and developing worlds together in an unprecedented era of partnership, advance collective prosperity and turn aid recipients into economic partners. Education is a foundational investment in national and global development and long-term prosperity, and strategic partnerships across sectors are vital to closing the gap and creating a shared path to progress.

At a side event of the UN General Assembly 2025, H.E. Bola Ahmed Tinubu, President of Nigeria and H.E. Giorgia Meloni, Prime Minister of Italy, will **launch the 5th Financing Campaign of the Global Partnership for Education** to catalyze a step-change in how we invest in education systems to meet the needs of today's - and tomorrow's - children and youth.

The Permanent Missions of Italy and Nigeria along with GPE will host a high-level side event at the UNGA to discuss the opportunity that investing quality education presents for the world and to showcase political will and commitment to bring quality education to all children.
